Tilley, Mitchell, Kenny and Archibald, for the Maritime Provinces. It was then con-sidered a strong Cabinet, and at various times it received such recruits as Messrs. Howe, Tupper, Rose and Hincks. Deaths and retirements have almost com-pletely changed its personnel of late, and now the Ontario section comprises, besi les the Premier, Messrs. A. Campbell, Aikens, O'Connor and Gibbs; the Que-Aikens, O'Connor and Gibbs; the Quebec section, Messrs Langevin, Pope, Robitaille and Masson, while the late Mr. Howe is replaced by Mr. H. McDonald, M. P. for Antigonish, Nova Scotia. It would be invidious to specify names, but no one who is at all acquainted with Canadian politics will fail to observe the loss of power in the Dominion Government implied by these changes. As it now stands it cannot be compared for a moment with the Opposition, which numbers in its ranks men of such calibre as Messrs. Blake, Mackenzie, Dorion, Holton, Joly and others.
