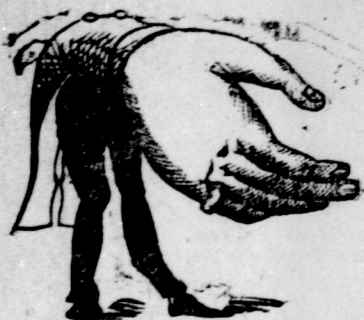

cents on the dollar.—Last week over 1,300 books were put
in circulation at the Free Library, an
increase of 20 per cent compared with
the previous week. Over 400 persons
made use of the magazines in the read-
ing room. The rush has been so great
that for a month past nothing has been
done in the way of cataloguing books.—The Lehigh Valley Railway man-
agement intends to hold an exhibition

building will probably be secured for
two days for the purpose. Admission
to the exhibition will be by invitation
only.—The regular monthly meeting of the
Charity Organization Society was held

inception, the members were much encour-
aged with what has already been accom-
plished, and its principles are being more
readily accepted than they were at the out-
set. A number of membership tickets were
issued, and other business of interest trans-

House—Wholesale Branch Nine
Years Old and Growing—Em-
ploy 25 Men and Two
Young Women.While Londoners are justly interest-
ed in such large questions as the G.
T. R. shops they should not lose sight
of the fact of the smaller business
and manufacturing establishments are
"salt and savor," as well as the very life
of the city. Some of these unosten-
tationous concerns employ more hands
and pay higher wages than most peo-
ple are aware of. A case in point is
the wholesale and retail house con-
ducted by Messrs. John and Phillip Po-
cock. This house can now lay claim
to the distinction of being the oldest
shoe firm in the city of London, hav-
ing been in business continuously since
1876 without even so much as a change
of initial. Other firms have come and
gone—with a meteoric flash they crossed
the business firmament of London
and disappeared, other houses changed
hands, took in partners, or in some
way or other lost their original identity,
but the firm of "Pooock Brothers" is
the same today as it was twenty years
ago.But while the firm is old established
the proprietors are still young and
firmly imbued with modern business
methods and ideas, under the applica-
tion of which the establishment has
built up such an enviable reputation on
the solid rock of success. Their estab-
lishment is metropolitan in dimen-
sions, facing both Dundas and Carling
streets. Nine years ago the firm con-
centrated their several branch houses,
and recognizing London's established
and growing reputation as a wholesale
center, opened up their wholesale
house—The London Shoe Company.
The offices of this portion of the busi-
ness are situated on Carling street.
Ever since the inception of the London
Shoe Company has been successful,
and lately it has been found necessary
to considerably increase the dimensions
of the building. This work is just
about completed, and the firm has now
in its wholesale branch no less than
10,000 square feet of flat or warehouse
room.The retail portion of the store faces
Dundas street, just opposite the Market
Lane. There are four flats and the
show windows are models of art and
ingenuity, and always engage atten-
tion. None but first-class clerks are
employed, and the salaries range from
\$600 up. By this means the proprietors
are able to insure for their customers
the immense benefit of experienced and
expert salesmen. The store is divided
into compartments, the front portion
being devoted to men's and youths'
goods. The rear compartment is set
apart for the use of lady customers.
The value of this plan is plain, and
is also highly appreciated by the lady
patrons of the place. The store has
recently been remodeled and a new
style of fittings introduced which great-
ly simplify the handling of goods. The
new fittings have a shelf capacity
which will accommodate 20,000 shoe-
boxes. The fittings cost over \$2,000.The first flat upstairs is utilized as
a trunk room, where the firm carries a
stock ranging from the packer to the
steamer trunk, as well as almost every
variety of valise made. The next flat
is used as a warehouse for staple goods,
while the top flat is used as a work-
shop for custom work and repairs.The firm employs constantly 25 men,
and two young women who assist the
bookkeeper, and is justly entitled to
rank as one of the leading city in-
dustries.Londoners generally are well acquai-
nted with the high class of goods
carried by Pooock Bros., but it will
not be out of place to mention that
they are the sole city agents for the
