

## FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

### PRICES FOR HAY ARE LOWER ON MARKET

Good Supply, But Quality Poor -Butter Scarce and No Poultry Is Offered.

Hay was again the feature of the market today, although most of the produce offered was of rather poor quality. The price is lower than it has been for several days. The general price was \$13 50, but many sold for \$12 per ton. Straw has declined, and \$8 per ton was the highest price paid on the square this morning. Oats this morning were of fair quality, and the offering was larger than usual. No change in the price was noticed, most loads selling for \$1 08 per cwt. A few

Wheat still continues to sell for high prices, and the supply is scarce on the market at present. From 93c to 95c per Eggs are rather scarce, and very few were on the square this morning. Late vesterday they were sold wholesale for 28c and 29c per dozen, which is as cheap as they are likely to go for the rest of the season, dealers say. The retail price continues at 31c and 32c per dozen.

Apples were on the square in large uantities this morning, but the price reains as quoted; \$1.25 was asked for bags of good quality fruit.

Potatoes remain as quoted, and the other vegetables, of which a few were on the market today, also-continue at about the same prices. Lettuce sold for 40c per dozen, and the quality was good.

Some dressed hogs were offered, but there is no change in the price. There will be less pork sold during the coming season than previously. No poultry was on the square today.
