Deposits from London public chools in the Penny Bank of Canada have shown large increases for the months of March and April. For March there was over \$2,500 more deposited during March of this year than for the same month last year. During April there was nearly \$1,000 more than for the same month in

In London schools deposits during March for the last three years have been: 1922, \$1,610.89; 1923, \$1,615.33; 1924, \$4,205.11. For the month of April over the same period the de-posits were: 1922, \$1,202.77; 1923, \$1,673.21; 1924, \$2,571.32.
For March and April of this year children of Canadian schools loaned \$100,877.93 to the government.


