

A PRUBIENT AGITATION.

UNHAPPY RESULTS OF THE RECENT REVELATIONS.

Immortality in England. Greatly on the increase - Unvarnished Attacks on Prominent People - The Hyde Park Meeting a Success.

LONDON, Aug. 22.—The Hyde park demonstration to-day, organized in behalf of the "social purity" movement, neither came up to the expectations of its promoters nor fulfilled the predictions of failure confidently made by its opponents.

The unhappy results of this present agitation are visible all over Great Britain and the continent. The various meetings on the subject of female reform, Germany and Italy have so increased that the French government has instructed its consuls to place on a solid basis, and that the approaching election of the Chamber of Deputies will be a triumph for the republic.

Scattered over the Italian papers reports that government officials in Naples, Rome, Florence and Trieste are now enforcing the law, which had been allowed to fall into disrepute against "free houses."

The Gospel Party association's agents persist in their attacks upon members of parliament and other prominent men. As a rule these gentlemen abstain from any notice of the attacks, but reporters have been allowed to publish the names of those who have refused to be named.
