THEY'RE IN THE FINAL FOR THE LEAFS PRIZES.

York County Curlers' Fifth Annual Tournament—Sixty Four Players on the Ice—Osgoode Hall Wins and Losses at Hockey—General Sporting News and Gossip.

The fifth annual tournament for prizes presented by Mr. H. Lemson, proprietor of the Clyde Hotel, Toronto, was commenced yesterday at the Parkdale rink, eight clubs from the county of York furnishing two rinks each, making 64 players in all.

The following were the clubs represented: Scarborough Maple Leaf, York, Aurora, Richmond Hill, Swansea and Little York.

The game was played on outside ice, finally placed as the disposal of the rinks by Messrs. Bouslog and Pease, managers of the rink. The ice was in good condition and the day a perfect one for open air curling and was thoroughly enjoyed by all who took part in the contest.

The first draw was called for 10 a.m., but owing to late start it was 11 before all the rinks were formed.

New York, Jan. 24.—The board of stewards representing the various tracks of the Grand Circuit held a meeting today at the Murray Hill Hotel and settled all their differences. The meeting was a secret one.

The most important matters to come up before the board were demands of Buffalo for a two-weeks' meeting, which was allowed them, and the admission of New York Driving Club to membership in the circuit with a date following Hartford meet.

All the associations in the circuit were represented at the meeting. The Detroit Club, of which Daniel Campy is the leading spirit, was also admitted to the Grand Circuit.

Data were agreed upon for the season as follows: Pittsburgh, July 11 to 14; Detroit, July 17 to 21; Cleveland, July 24 to 28; Buffalo, Aug. 1 to 12; Rochester, Aug. 15 to 18; Springfield, Aug. 22 to 25; Hartford, Aug. 29 to Sept. 1; New York Driving Club, Sept. 5 to 8; Philadelphia, Sept. 12 to 15. All the foregoing dates are inclusive.
