### SAVING OF WOOL AND COTTON

Conservation Important Because of Shortage and Mending Should Receive Careful Consideration.

Mending day assumes new importance and the mending bag takes on unwonted dignity now that war conditions prevail. Once it was perhaps our own affair whether or not we mended as conscientiously as our neighbor. But now that there is a shortage of wool and no great abundance of other fabrics it amounts to a positive sin to throw away any garments so long as they may be mended into usefulness at any reasonable expenditure of time and energy, says an exchange.

If we feel that our own time is too valuable to spend on the mending then we should employ some one to do the task for us. There are always old or semi-invalid persons who would be glad to do the mending either as a help for their own support or, if they are well provided for, as means of earning money for some charity or other work.

Even if we do not save a very great deal of actual money by having the old clothes mended we should attend to it, for in so doing we are conserving wool and cotton—an act almost as important as conserving wheat and meat.

### Overcoming Camouflage.

An American physicist believes that the advantages of camouflage—or at least certain kinds of camouflage—can be overcome by an opposing army by providing its airmen and other scouts with colored glasses or screens of contrasting colors to use with field glasses, notes *Popular Mechanics Magazine*. When the colors of these screens are properly selected, uniforms and other objects may be made to appear in contrast, instead of in harmony, with their surroundings, he claims. Camouflage as practiced in many cases is accomplished largely by the use of paint, objects being given shades, that blend with the landscape. In spite of certain difficulties that would arise, it is believed that such efforts at concealment could be rendered quite ineffectual by the means stated.

### Should Eat Mushrooms.

Wild mushrooms are a food that should be more largely utilized in this country now that food is scarce, according to William A. Murrill, assistant director of the New York botanical gardens, who thinks the people should be taught how to distinguish the poisonous from the wholesome varieties. Wild mushrooms are eaten in this country almost exclusively by the foreign-born population.

Appropos of the campaign throughout Canada for enlistment of boys as Soldiers of the Soil, the following editorial comment from The *Prairie Farmer*, of Illinois is interesting:

"One of the chief reasons why every farmer who can use a boy from the Boy's Working Reserve should do so this year is that he may be trained for more efficient work in 1919. We ought to use 25,000 of these boys on our Illinois farms this year. We will, in most cases, find them much better farm hands than we now think possible. But most important of all, we will

have that number of trained farm hands for 1919. When that year comes we will thank God for these boys who were trained in advance, for without them it will be impossible to keep up agricultural production."
