

SAVING OF WOOL AND COTTON

Conservation Important Because of Shortage and Mending Should Re-ceive Careful Consideration.

But now that there is a shortage of wool and no great abundance of other fabrics it amounts to s positive sin to throw away any garments so long as they may be mended into usefulness at any reasonable expenditure of time and energy, says an exchange.

Overcoming Camouflage.

An American physicist believes that the advantages of camouflage-or at least certain kinds of camouflagecan be overcome by an opposing army by providing its airmen and other scouts with colored glasses or screens of contrasting colors to use with field glasses, notes Popular Mechanics Magazine. When the colors of these screens are properly selected, uniforms and other objects may be made to appear in contrast, instead of in harmony, with their surroundings, he claims. Camouflage as practiced in many cases is accomplished largely by the use of paint, objects being given shades, that blend with the landscape.
