ship thief, who committed so many robberies on the Allan and White Star Lines, has been found guilty, in the criminal court of Quebec, of robbery on board the steamer *Circassian*. There are still four charges pending against him. His last exploit was to rob Sir Philip Wodehouse, Governor of Bom-bay, of £500, and some valuable dia-monds. — At Wytherville, Va., Mrs. Hodgins, a young woman, killed her husband, a young man about twenty-eight years of age, by mixing arsenic in the bread, which the man ate of heartily. He was very ill, and died soon afterward. After committing the deed, the murderess endeavored to hide her guilt by drag-ging the body to a creek and throwing it in. She has made a full confession of the crime, and is in jail.—*Ex*.


