

Welland Canal Enlargement.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for the Welland Canal," will be received at this office from mechanical, skilled, practical contractors, until the arrival of the Eastern and Western mails on TUESDAY, the 9th day of MARCH next, for raising the walls of the locks, weirs, &c., and increasing the height of the banks of that part of the Welland Canal between Port Dalhousie and Thorold.

The works, throughout, will be let in Sections. A Map showing the different places, together with plans and descriptive specifications, can be seen at this office on and after TUESDAY, the 23rd of February instant, where printed forms of tender can be obtained. A like class of information relative to the works will be supplied at the Resident Engineer's Office, Thorold.

Parties tendering are requested to examine the locality and bear in mind that the season and circumstances under which the works have to be done render some of them of an exceptional nature. Tenders will not be considered unless made strictly in accordance with printed forms, and in the case of firms, except there are attached the actual signatures, the nature of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the firm; and further, a bank deposit receipt for the sum of Two Thousand Dollars or more—according to the work on the section—must accompany the respective tenders, which sum shall be forfeited if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the works, at the rates stated in the offer submitted.

The amount required in each case will be stated on the form of tender. The deposit receipts thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.
