

The Garrison Artillery Competition.

BELOW will be found the detailed scores of the competing batteries at the Dominion Artillery Association's prize meeting held at the Island of Orleans from the 5th to the 10th inst. The scores are official, having been kindly furnished us by the secretary, Capt. J. B. Donaldson. The meeting passed off very successfully. Regimental Intelligence.

The 63rd Rifles and the 66th Princess Louise Fusiliers of Halifax, were inspected by Major General Middleton on Wednesday of last week.

The camp of No. 9 military district, at Aldershot, was brought to a close on Saturday last. On the previous day Major General Middleton inspected the brigade.

The Fifth Royal Scots are anxious to establish a mounted infantry and signalling corps in connection with the regiment, but the militia authorities do not approve of the idea being carried out at present.

Montreal volunteers express annoyance at the continued occupation of a portion of the Champ de Mars by contractors for the new drill hall, who, though the work there is finished, show no disposition to remove their huts.
