



Canadian Canals

These views of the Lachine Canal show the beauty as well as the utility of the oldest canal in the country. The first shows the bridge at Lachine; the second, alongside, gives the old and new Black's Bridges, Montreal; the third, looking east, shows the C.P.R. bridge in the distance; the fourth, a regulating weir and bridge; the fifth, regulating weir No 1, near Black's Bridge, when the water is out of the canal; the new lock at Cote St Paul; and the bottom picture is of the old Lachine Canal, opened in 1700 by the Sulpicians, who utilized the Riviere St. Pierre as the connecting link with Montreal.
