Mr. MEIGHEN: I presume that the act of 1923 repealed the former act and consequently this change is necessary.

Mr. ROBB: Yes.

Section agreed to. Bill reported.

ADJOURNMENT—BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Mr. ROBB: If there is no objection, there is a resolution regarding Finland that we might advance to the stage of introducing the bill. It is order No. 56.

Mr. MEIGHEN: What does it do?

Mr. ROBB: It gives us the benefit of their favoured nation treatment. As to the business done, they sold us last year \$6,000 worth and we sold them \$1,754,000 worth. We can discuss the principle when we get into the biil.

Mr. MEIGHEN: Well, I would not object to the matter being advanced to the second reading so that no time will be lost, but I would prefer not to have the resolution pass in the absence of the hon. member for West York (Sir Henry Drayton).

Mr. ROBB: All right.
