Present investigation was to find out the source of the red colour. It has been traced to the use of solar salt. Sc., F.R.S.C. Characteristic modifications occur in the leaves of diseased plants. Mottling is due to diminution of the chlorophyll content in certain areas and is concurrent with changes in tissue development.
