

ed in place and stead of the said eighteen feet.—And, in such case, the same precautions, formalities and obligations shall be observed as in the deposit permitted by the said fourth article, and under the penalties denounced by the same against the contraveners thereof.

ARTICLE 62.—In addition to the fifty eighth article of the Regulations of Police now in force, "which enjoins to the inhabitants of this city, and to the company of proprietors of the Water Works of Montreal, certain obligations therein specified, in opening any street, lane or public square in the city or suburbs for any purpose whatever, and fixes certain penalties against delinquents;" it is ordered that, for the future, every person who, by contract passed between him and three justices of the peace of this city, or between him and the surveyor of Roads of this city, or who, by verbal agreement in presence of one or several witnesses or engagement under private signature between him and the said three Justices of the Peace or surveyor, shall undertake to open any of the said streets, lanes, or public squares, for the purpose of constructing drains or public sewers, or for any other cause whatever, shall be subject to the obligations imposed by the said fifty-eight article, and in default of conformity thereto, shall incur the penalties denounced by the same against every delinquent.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF POLICE FOR THE CITY AND SUBURBS OF MONTREAL.

The court after having examined the rules and regulations of Police, for the city and suburbs of Montreal, made at the Court of General Quarter sessions of the peace, held in the Court-House in the city of Montreal on Saturday the tenth of January last, and continued by adjournment until the nineteenth of the same month, and the tenor of which is as follows :

Here the Rules and Regulations above written, are inserted anew without alteration or amendment.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held in the Court House in the City of Montreal, on Saturday the 10th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, and continued by adjournment till the 19th of the same month, in virtue and under the authority of a Provincial Act of the fifty seventh year of George the Third, chapter 16, intituled "An Act to provide more effectually for the Regulation of the Police in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and the Town of Three Rivers, and for other purposes :"

Ordered, that the following Rules and Regulations of Police, be in force for the City of Montreal.

No Hucksters or venders of provisions, small wares or their Tables, Benches, Seats or Stands on the foot-path before the Houses fronting and situated upon the Old and New Markets, nor between the said Houses and the Streets or Carriage-ways of the said Markets, nor in any other public place, save only the covered Benches of the said Markets, except the spaces specially appropriated by the third Article of the Regulations, respecting the Markets for the sale of Salt Pork, Fish and other articles.—And every Huckster, Vender of Provisions, Small Wares or other articles and every other person contravening this Rule, shall for each offence or contravention pay a fine of not less than Ten Shillings, nor more than Twenty Shillings Currency.
