PRUSSIA'S BIG LOAN

GOVERNMENT URGED TO BUILD HYDRO-ELECTRIC RADIAL LINE

Deputation From Municipalities Near Toronto Want Better Facilities For Marketing Produce—Sir James Whitney Spoke Encouragingly and Line May Be Built.

With the request that the Hydro-Electric Power Commission construct and operate an electric radial railway to link up Toronto with a number of municipalities, such as Unionville, Uxbridge, Stouffville, Markham and others, a deputation of about 200 men waited upon the government yesterday...

Because of present inadequate railway facilities municipalities near Toronto joined with a view to securing an electric radial. The Grand Trunk is the only railway which touches the municipalities near Toronto...

Their plan of financing the project was for all the municipalities to issue bonds, the government to guarantee them, so as to get a good market and low interest.

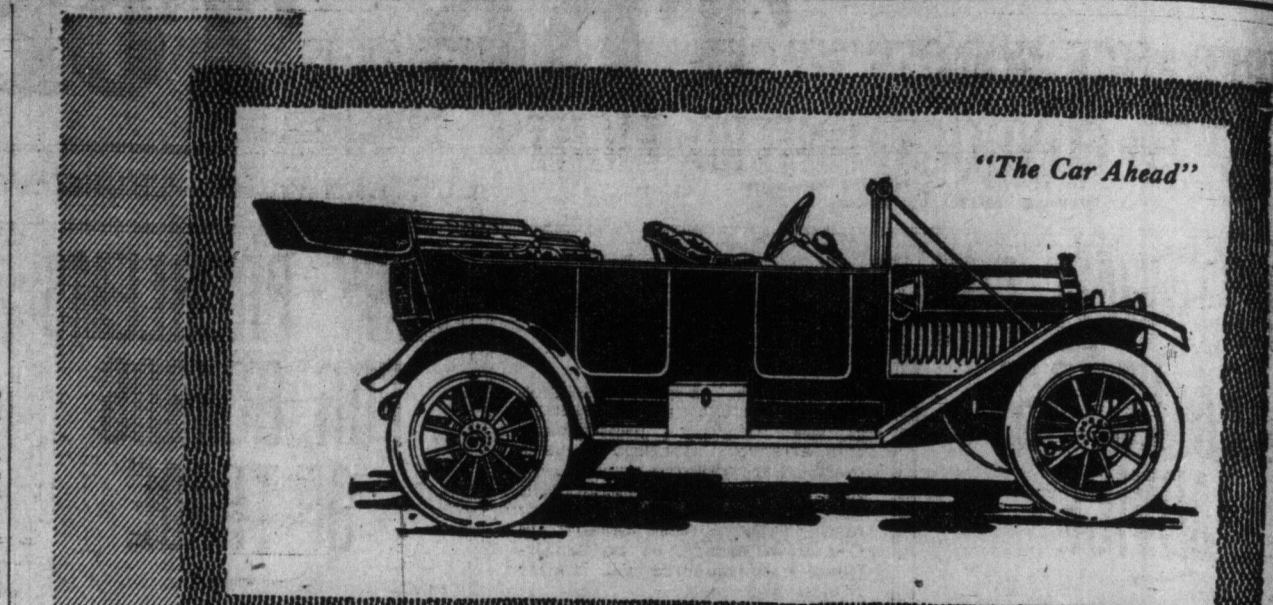
