

Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Lutry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (bu, not Sub-Agency) on certain constons. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cuttvation of the land in each of three years.
