3.50 p. m.—His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales will leave the Citadel accompanied by His Excellency the Governor General, attended by the members of the Suite, and proceed to the Champlain statue, where he will be received by the Mayor and presented with an address from the City of Quebec.

Levee Dress will be worn.

The streets will be lined with troops.

A Field Officer's Escort will accompany His Royal Highness, to and from the statue.

A Guard of Honour will be mounted at the statue.

5.00 P. M.—There will be a State Dinner at the Citadel, where a Guard of Honour will be mounted, at 7.30 p. m.
