

ing, the Lieutenant-Governor shall, if the majority of votes at the school district meeting has been favourable to the erection of a district, forthwith proclaim the district in accordance to the terms of the petitions addressed to him in that behalf.

DUTIES OF TRUSTEES.

Section 48.—It shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees in every school district to select and acquire a suitable school site as near as possible to the centre of the district ; to engage a competent teacher ; to have custody of all school property ; to make such assessment on real and personal property within the district as may be necessary to defray all lawful expenses connected with the management of the school.

GOVERNMENT AID TO SCHOOLS.

Section 90.—Grants shall be paid to every school organized under this Ordinance, as follows :—

(a) A grant of 75 per cent. of the teacher's salary to every school employing a teacher holding a first-class certificate from the Board of Education of the North-West Territories.

(b) A grant of 70 per cent. of the teacher's salary to every school employing a teacher holding a second-class certificate from the Board of Education.

(c) A grant of 65 per cent. of the teacher's salary to every school employing a teacher holding a third-class certificate from the Board of Education.

GRANTS—WHEN PAID.

Section 91.—All grants to be paid to the treasurers of the school districts, quarterly, after the last days of March, June, September and December in each year.
