block elevates you so that you will not have to make a spring in order to get on the horse's back, but from it you an gradually raise yourself into the saddle. When you take these precautions there is no horse so wild, but what you can mount him without making him jump. I have tried it on the worst horse that could be found, and I have never failed in any case. When mounting, your horse should always stand without being held. A horse is never well broke when he has to be held with a tight rein while mounting; and a colt is never so safe to mount him, as when you see that assurance of confidence, and absence of fear, which causes him to stand without holding.

HOW TO RIDE THE COLT.

When you want him to start do not touch him on the side with your heel or do anything to frighten him or make him jump. But speak to him kindly, and if he does not start, pull him a little to the left until he starts, then let him walk off slowly with the
