HAMBURG BELLE AT ODDS ON WON THE BRIGHTON MILE

Whimsical Was Second and Flip Flap Third in Feature Race on Opening Day.

New York, July 11.—Hamburg Belle, the 15 to 20 favorite, won the Brighton mile, the feature of the opening of Brighton Beach midsummer meeting, to-day, and the daughter of Hamburg-Isaac and her rider, Miller, were loudly cheered. The Brighton is started in front of the stand, and Starter Dodge was cheered for the good send-off. The four horses broke head and head, and ran in this order for fully 100 feet, when Whimsical showed with a slight advantage over Hamburg Belle. These two drew away from the field as they raced around the paddock, turned into the back stretch with Flip Flap, an added entrant, in third place, Whimsical continued to lead the favorite by a neck at the three-quarter pole, but as the stretch Hamburg Belle had taken the lead from Whimsical, Flip Flap then began to close, but the favorite had enough left in a drive by a head from Whimsical, who beat Flip Flap a head for the place.
