WOMAN SENT TO JAIL TO PREVENT SUICIDE

Authorities Take Care of Mrs. Rodzyk—Thos. Lovejoy Dead—Mr. Southam's Gift.

HAMILTON, July 14.—(Special).—Thomas Lovejoy, 150 South Lockeside, who fell off a horse, at Victoria Park last Sunday, after lingering in an unconscious state for nearly a week, died last night. He was 20 years of age.

There was a big row at James and Mulberry-streets Saturday evening. Thomas Simpson, 13 Mulberry-street, was quarrelling with an Italian, who pulled a stiletto, and stabbed him on the shoulder.

Mrs. Rodzyk, the wife of the man murdered last Friday, was taken to the jail this morning. She threatened suicide if her husband died of his wounds, and although she had not been told of her husband's death, the authorities considered that it was better to take no chances, and had her removed to the jail until after the trial in all probability. She was not seriously wounded.

thing became as solid as a drum the vibration caused by the cars had ceased.

"Prof. Geologist" went even further and said that in two or three years the conditions of both oil and gas would show on the earth's surface. This appears to be precisely what has happened.

At any rate Mr. Willis has enough faith in the place to give it a try. To the World yesterday he stated it was his belief that Canada possessed possibilities in oil production that that in the next three years the production of Canada would exceed its mineral production. His company is in possession of 40,000 acres of land in the Manitoulin Islands, where they have had five rigs working for some time, and the five wells are each producing fifty barrels per acre at \$1.80 per barrel. He intends putting twenty-five rigs at work on this property immediately.

"Oil is only found in Trenton rock, and the depth of the Trenton rock strata when you locate it governs the quantity of oil.

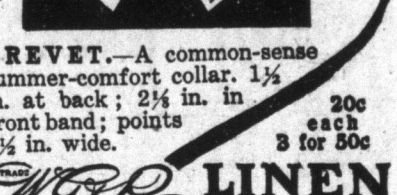
The deepest strata of this kind is found in the United States have ranged from 70 to 90 feet. In the Manitoulin Islands it has been found to be 130 to 160 feet. As yet no one knows how deep down it will be necessary to drill before Trenton rock is located at Cooksville, and when it is located it will depend upon the depth of the deposit as to whether the district will produce oil in any quantity. However, the company is willing to put \$40,000 into the experiment. In leasing the land from the farmers the company pays \$1 for exclusive rights and a privilege to search for, produce and take away petroleum and natural gas; to have and to hold the premises for five years and to produce in paying quantities. The company agrees to deliver to the owner, in tanks or pipe lines, one-eighth part of all oil produced on the premises, and if gas is found, to pay 15 per cent. of the net profits each year for the production of each well, and also provide sufficient heat and light to heat the house on the premises; to pay all damages done to growing crops by reason of operations; not to drill within 200 feet of the buildings, or in the orchard, except by consent of the owner; in case no well is completed within three years the grant shall become null and void unless the company pays a rental of \$5 per month in advance until such time as the well is completed, said rental not payable except upon the election of the company to hold the premises beyond the five years. All payments to be made thru the Sterling Bank at Cooksville.

The company shall have sufficient oil, water or gas necessary to run all machinery and right to lay pipe lines for oil, etc., across the premises, and to connect with any other existing machinery. The company can surrender the lease at any time it sees fit, whereupon it becomes null and void.

EXPLOSION HURTS FIREMEN

Five Windsor Men More or Less Injured at Early Blaze.

WINDSOR, July 14.—(Special).—Two local explosions at the plant of the Windsor Gas Company, on McDougall-street, early this morning, started the residents of that locality and incidentally singed and shook up three firemen and two spectators, in addition to snatching a number of windows.

The first explosion was being investigated by the fire department when the second occurred, due to an open lantern in the hands of one of the firemen.

Assistant Chief Defolides, Firemen Cakelbread and Doumouchelle, William Chick, a stoker at the gas works, and Dennis Reddins, a spectator, were all badly scorched. Reddins was blown from the sidewalk out into the middle of the street and did not recover consciousness for many hours.

Leaking pipes and a lighted lamp are blamed for the explosions, but an investigation will probably be ordered.

CARTER CO. VICTORIOUS

U.S. Court Says it is Exclusively Entitled to Red Package for Pills.

The Carter Medicine Company of New York states that its exclusive right as owner of Little Liver Pills to the red package has just been again confirmed by two important decrees of the United States Circuit Court sitting at Trenton, N.J.

The Carter Medicine Company, in that court, is an injunction restraining a Cambden (N.J.) pill manufacturer from using a red-colored package for his pills, and in an exclusive right to the Carter Company. A similar result occurs in a suit to enjoin a retail druggist from selling pills in red packages.

The decrees direct the defendants, among other things, to deliver up to the Carter Company, for destruction, all infringing wrappers, packages, bottles and labels, and to account to the complainant, and to pay the damages found due, as well as the costs of the action.

While the Carter Medicine Company's sole right to the red package has been upheld by many previous adjudications, these decisions are considered of special importance, in view of the high character and standing of the court which pronounced them.
