

UNIVERSITY Y. M. C. A. TO ERECT NEW BUILDING

Religious Work Among Students Progressing—Campaign to Raise \$75,000 Will Start at Once.

The University College Young Men's Christian Association was originally organized on March 25, 1873. Thirteen years later the present building was formally opened and a general secretary was appointed to give two hours a day to the work.

The membership fee, which prior to this year has been one dollar, is now voluntary, and any student making application for membership and declaring himself in sympathy with the work will be considered a member.

Last year the University Y.M.C.A. contributed \$655.53 for the support and education of Chinese students in Tokio through the international committee in New York.

The present quarters of the Y.M.C.A. have long been inadequate and a new building is to be erected at a cost of \$75,000. C. K. Calhoun, international field secretary, and T. H. Billings, Canadian students' secretary, both of Montreal, are coming to Toronto to conduct a campaign among the students.
