

## COUCY-LE-CHATEAU FALLS TO FRENCH

**Allies Capture Another Village in Advance South of Oise.**

Paris, March 27.—The village of Coucy-le-Chateau was captured by the French in an attack last night, the war office announces. Further progress was made in the lower section of Coucy forest, all of the northern part of which is now held by the

The statement follows: "South of the Oise we continued to make progress in the lower forest of Coucy, all of the northern part of which we occupied. The enemy was driven beyond the Barisis-Servais line. South of the forest our troops made a brilliant night attack, and captured

"In the region north of Soissons we captured a farm northwest of Margival, and a point of support held in strength by the enemy.

"In the Argonne we made a successful surprise attack in the sector

In Lorraine enemy attacks on small French posts in the region of Letri-court were repulsed completely.

*"Elsewhere the night passed in quiet."*
