BRITISH CATTLE MARKETS. Two Boston Boys Have a Plant in Operation Beyond Their Homes. Boston, Nov. 23.—Newell A. Thompson, Jr., 15 years old, has established in the home of his aunt, Mrs. Frederick Barton, at 21 Brook-street, a wireless telegraph apparatus. In the home of a schoolmate, Samuel Brock, half a mile away, is an exact counterpart of the device used by young Thompson. Both boys have been working on the system for some time and have advanced it to such a degree that they have established communication with each other. The transmitter used by Thompson is his own invention, and it is a modified form of the Hertz oscillator.

In addition, he fired two shots at Ella Scott, whose refusal to accept his attentions aroused his jealousy.

Hold-Up at Turkey Rate. Minneapolis, Minn., Nov. 23.—During a turkey raffle in a suburban saloon last night, three masked men covered their faces with revolvers. The bartender searched for his revolver and was shot in the face. This started a general fracas, one man was killed. The robbers secured \$200.

Stated Arbitration Treaty. Washington, Nov. 23.—Secretary of State Hay and the Viscount De Azevedo signed an arbitration treaty between the United States and Portugal. The treaty is identical with the American-French arbitration treaty.
