SITUATION IN DAIRY MARKET

New Season Opens With Exceptionally High Prices Prevailing.

(Montreal Gazette, Monday.)
With the opening up of the new season the dairy produce markets are beginning to display more activity, and from now on widespread interest will be taken in the progress of the season. The season is opening up somewhat earlier than usual, a large number of the cheese and butter factories having already begun operations, and the first meetings of several of the boards being held today. In some of the principal sections, such as the Brockville section, the season is cold and backward, and the make of fodder comparatively small, but the high prices prevailing are giving an incentive to the factory men to produce as much as possible. Prices both for cheese and butter, and especially for the latter, are opening up high. At Brockville, today 11 1/2 cents was reported to have been paid for new made. At this date last year, at Brockville, 12c was paid for colored, while white sold for a fraction lower. At the first meeting of the Belleville board, which was held today, 11 1/2c was bid without any sales being made, the factorymen holding out for 12c. At the opening meeting of the Belleville board last year the price obtained was 12 1/4c. One factory in the Belleville district is reported to have sold its April make for 13c. At Cowansville today 11 1/4c was obtained for a small lot of new cheese. It is in the butter market, however, that the season, owing to unusual circumstances, is opening up with exceptionally high prices. At Cowansville today as high as 31 7/8c—the highest price obtained in many years—was paid for new milk creamery, and at the opening meeting of St. Hyacinthe board the range was 28c to 31 1/2c. These exceptional prices for butter are due entirely to the comparatively small make so far as a consequence the farmers owing to bad roads being unable to get their milk to the factories, recent prices are away above those paid at this date last year, in fact, they are almost unprecedented. At this date last year new milk creamery was selling on the spot at 26c to 26 1/2c, and at the first meeting of the St. Hyacinthe board, which was not held last year until April 23, new milk creamery sold at 26c. The exceptional prices at present ruling are not likely to continue very long after supplies show any material increase, but at present receipts are very light, which naturally makes holders very firm in their views. The local cheese market continues quiet, receipts of new make so far being small, quotations for which are 12 1/4c to 12 1/2c, while old cheese is quoted nominally at 13 3/4c to 14c. The local butter market continues decidedly strong, and owing to light receipts the high prices paid in the country are, it would not be surprising to see higher prices. Holders were today quoted at 31c for new milk creamery, 30 1/2c for 165 packages, and 29 1/2c for 579 packages.

WITNESSED

A TRAGEDY

Officers of Steamer Vinland Tell of a Murder in Kingston Harbor.

Officers of the Vinland, which arrived here yesterday say they were eyewitnesses to a murder committed in Kingston harbor a day or two before the steamer left. The Vinland was lying alongside a schooner which was taking in cargo. Two negroes were working on her and got into an altercation with the result that one was knocked off the dock into the harbor. The victim was drowned and the murderer jumped into the water and made for the open sea. Small boats put out and the negro was captured. He became unmanageable and was taken aboard the Vinland and securely bound. The officers say that it was terrible to witness the grief and fear of the man.
