

## Russians Again Drive Them Back

London, Sept. 29.—(Frederick Remond telegraphs to the Daily News.)—Renewing their furious attack upon Drinsk, the Germans have been repulsed everywhere, and the Russian positions remain unchanged. All the trenches demolished by the German artillery fire were re-erected during the night, with strong barbed wire protections. Against these the Germans have heaped up a wall of bodies.

"On other parts of the front, the Ger-

mans meet the same stubborn resistance. German cavalry, which under General Schmetzow endeavored to envelop the Vilna army, was attacked and dispersed by Russian cavalry at Balanovo, northwest of Vitebsk. General Schmetzow's forces are in a most critical position.

"Experts on the general staff say there are twenty-three Teutonic corps operating on the front from Riga to the upper Niemen."
