BY ORDER OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAINT JOHN

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that a bill will be presented for enactment at the next session of the Legislature entitled "An Act in further amendment of 'The Saint John City Assessment Act 1907' and to amend the laws relating to civic franchises."

The object of the bill is—
1. to exempt all incomes from personal labor and occupation up to and including \$1000 per annum; also to exempt \$500 of each such income above \$1000, and not exceeding \$2000;
2. to impose a poll tax of \$2.00 and no more upon all persons whose incomes are totally exempt from taxation;
3. to exempt all household furniture from taxation where the value does not exceed \$500;
4. to provide that the last day in which the Common Council shall have power to determine and direct assessments shall be held in the City of Saint John shall be the 8th day instead of the 15th day of January in each year;
5. to amend the provisions of Section 22 of the said Act in relation to civic franchises so that the same shall give the same right to vote at civic elections which the \$5.00 poll tax now does.
