The body will be taken to Economy, N. S., for burial.

A wide circle of friends will regret to learn of the death of Mrs. Mary Johanna Coughlan which occurred on Saturday at the home of her son, Rev. Harold L. Coughlan, in Loch Lomond. **FRENCH WARRING WITH TRIBESMEN**

Using Army of 25,000 to Subdue Fanatical Taza People in French Morocco.

Taza, French Morocco, May 7—A French army of 25,000 has begun a campaign against the warlike tribe of the Beni Bouart as one phase of the pacification of the Taza tribesmen which commenced on April 12. The French troops in four columns swept to work southward, meeting the columns entering the savage country from the other end of the line.

Heavy action has been reported, but the extent of the casualties has not been reported. The French are prepared for a hard campaign as the unconquered tribes always have fought with fanatical enthusiasm.
