CANADA'S TRADE.

Frederic Hudd, Canadian Trade Commissioner in New York, presented an impressive outline of the growth of Canada's trade to a group of New Yorkers the other day, and impressed upon his audience the fact that the United States in the future must count more and more upon Canadian competition in foreign markets. He said in part:

"One of the most market evidences of Canada's development is in her export trade. In 1900 these exports were \$177,000,000. In 1920 they were \$1,286,000,000. Thus in twenty years Canada's export trade has increased almost tentimes. At present Canada, with only 9,000,000 of people, is exceeded only in exports by the United States and Great Britain, and in imports by the United States. France and Italy. Indeed, in due time Canada will be making her bid for the trade of the world.

"Of Canada's total trade with the world, more than one-half is done with the United States than she sells to any other country. Canada buys more from the United States than any other country—except Great Britain. Canada's purchases from the United States in one year represents \$96 per head of the population.
