California \$50 Octagonal Gold Piece of 1915 Fetches \$127. The sale of rare coins, medals, tokens and paper money from the Lynch, Tilden and other collections was concluded in New York recently. The total was

in New York recently. The total string of the period of 1860-2, uncirculated, sold for \$127. A choice Japanese Oban of the period of 1860-2, uncirculated, sold for \$100. One rare Oregon exchange \$5 in gold brought \$128.

The 1802 half dime went for \$180. The Martha Washington "half disme" of 1792 was knocked down for \$88. The half dollar of 1796, sixteen stars, brought \$135, and the same issue, with fifteen stars, \$105. The silver dollar of 1836 with Gobrecht's name in the field, instead of on the base, brought \$165. Only eighteen of these coins were made. The gold dollar of 1836, alloyed with silver went for \$110.
