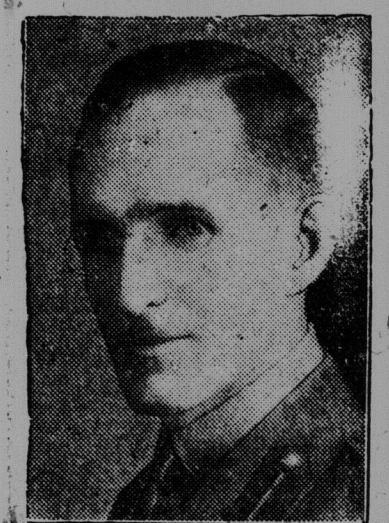
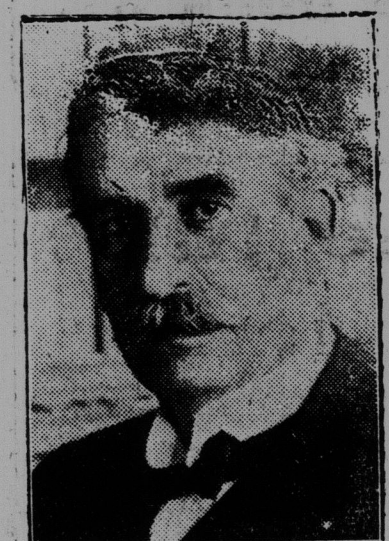

Miss Bickle of Toronto won the ladies' open singles championship by defeating Miss West, 6-3, 6-4.

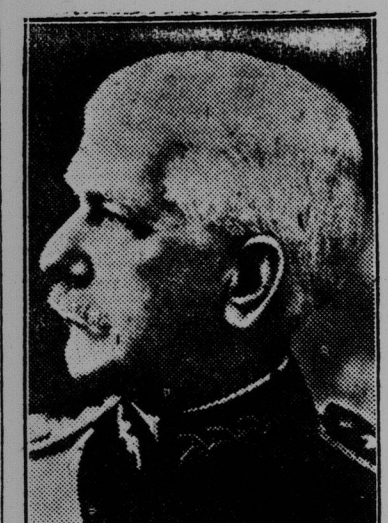

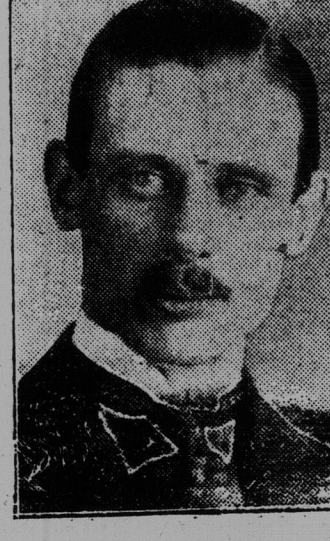
"Mr. Harding's personality is remarkable. He is of commanding presence, considerably above the average in height, is not heavily built, but is not spare. His voice, of wonderful quality, is a great asset as a speaker. He was received by those Maine people who heard him then with great enthusiasm, I remember. 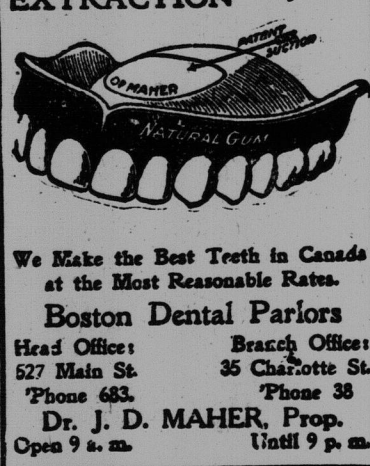

BOARD'S FINDING  
IN THE GENERAL  
ELECTRIC STRIKE

Employees' Demands Practically All Met—Company Has Not Yet Accepted the Award.

Peterboro, Ont., June 28.—The board of conciliation which was appointed at the request of the Peterboro city council to investigate the labor dispute between the Canadian General Electric Company and its machinists recommends that first class machinists be paid not less than 75 cents an hour; second-class machinists not less than 70 cents an hour; specialists not less than 60 cents an hour; all class specialists 55 cents an hour and helpers 50 cents an hour.  
The men to the number of 400 have been on strike for six weeks. It is not known yet whether or not the company will accept the award.  
The union's original demand was 80 cents an hour for machinists, 64 cents for specialists and 55 cents for helpers. This was subsequently reduced five cents in each class.
