


Eastern Canada Championships.

About a year ago I had lunch at the same table with him, and as it happens with Mr. Johnson, my impression of Mr. Harding are, however, those which come closer to Maine people than my acquaintance with him in Washington, for I have had opportunities to know him and observe the impressions made by him upon Maine people when I have been on the speaking campaign programme with him. We were in Valde county together and among other places we spoke at Belfast and Unity.

"Mr. Harding's personality is remarkable. He is of commanding presence, considerably above the average in height, is not heavily built, but is not spare. His voice, of wonderful quality, is a great asset as a speaker. He was received by those Maine people who heard him then with great enthusiasm, I remember. He impressed me, too, as a man having a broad and comprehensive grasp of national and international problems; and then, too, he seems to have the quality of adaptability perhaps characteristic of him as a newspaperman, a result of that training, showing in his ability to understand local problems. He is, in short, one of the most effective campaigners I have ever met.
"So far as comparing him with McKinley is concerned, I think I would say that his poise, his kindliness, his general bearing would remind one of General Gorgas, His Majesty complimented him on his great achievement in conquering Malaria in the canal zone by medical science, saying that in this way the construction of the canal was made possible.
