

BUSINESS TO WHICH PRESBYTERIES ARE REQUIRED TO
GIVE ATTENTION.

1. Election of a representative to the Sustentation Board by each Presbytery, at the meeting held last before next meeting of Synod, (*vide* Minutes 1870, pp. 27.)
2. To take steps to have all arrears to the Synod Fund paid by defaulting Kirk-Sessions within their bounds, (*vide* Minutes pp. 44.)
3. Presbyteries are required to inquire at each ordinary meeting and record in their Minutes what congregations within their bounds have made Special Collection or Collections in behalf of the Schemes of the Church falling due since their previous meeting. (Act anent Public Collections, pp. 45, 46.)
4. To consider and report to next meeting of Synod on the Overture anent Minimum Stipend. (Minutes pp. 43.)
5. To take steps at first ordinary meeting to carry out provisions of the Overture anent the better support of the Ministry. (Minutes, pp. 43.)
6. To consider and report on special remit anent the Basis of Union and accompanying Resolutions. (Minutes, pp. 32, 35.)
