Sir

I have the honor, to inform you, that I was waited on, on Saturday last, by White Eagle & Young Chief, the two Sioux chiefs in this Province who had come down, to see about the Reserve, which is being laid off for them at Berres Creek on the Assiniboine River.

They said, it was being laid off in a square form, chiefly Prairie land with only two small patches of poplar wood, and did not contain land enough for the tribe.

I explained to them, that the Fort Ellice Indians, were to have a Reserve assigned to themselves and that eighty acres would be assigned to every family of five, who settled on their own Reserve.
