BERLIN, June 22—Another military sambling seandal is reported from Hambur. The military riding school of that lifty under the command of General you Festenberg, is one of the best known in Germany, and is largely attended by officers of crack cavalry regiments. For some time past it has been suspected that the officers were in the habit of meeting at one of the Hanover hotels for the purposes of play, but it was regarded as comparatively harmless until the father of a young lieutenant reported to General Festenberg that his son had contracted gambling debts which neither he hor his son was able to settle.

General Festenberg opened an inquiry, with the result that about twenty officers have been ordered various terms of barrack arrest, and about fifteen others ordered to return to their regiments.
