## REPORT.

THE Executive Committee in presenting their fourteenth Annual Report to the Associated Alumni, have great pleasure in congratulating the friends of the College, on the efficient and prosperous state of the Institution. The number of students has steadily increased since the last annual meeting, some of whom have come from the sister Province, from whence in former years the University received considerable support.

In accordance with the resolution passed at the annual meeting in June last, your committee have expended the sum of £25, in the purchase of a collection of Nova Scotian Silurian Fossils, from the Rev. Mr. Honeyman, of Antigonish, which were approved of by the Professor of Natural Science, and no doubt will be of great

assistance to him in the labors of his department.

The expenditure thus incurred necessitated the suspension of the usual grant, which has been made for the last three years, for the purchase of books for the College Library, but which is now avail-

able for that purpose.
