

SOUTH AFRICAN WARRANTS.

Chicago, May 26.—It was like a market in war times today on change, Leading longs unloaded more than 3,000,000 bushels of Sept. wheat in lots of 500,000. One house alone purchased a line of six million bushels. The protective retirement at temporarily of one of the most conspicuous speculators in the world, was among the causes. Another was the almost simultaneous settlement of big dealings in May wheat which whereby other traders of prominence apparently have an exciting experience.
