

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty years, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 250 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. In unreserved territory the tract must be staked out by stony or other permanent marks, and the applicant in person, and personal application to the Agent or Sub-Agent of Dominion Lands for the district, must be made in all cases before the rental for the first year must be paid to the agent within thirty days after staking.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over, having made a discovery may locate a claim 1500 feet by 1500 feet. At least 1500 must be discovered on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When 1500 has been expended or paid, and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1 an acre.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, at least \$200 per annum. Royalty, 5% per cent after the output exceeds 150,000.
