ANOTHER MONCTON DIVORCE HEARING

Case of Oscar Herman Trites
vs. Annie Evelyn Trites Up
—Guilt Proven—Victoria
County Case.

Fredericton, July 11.—Rapid progress
is being made by the Divorce Court
in the hearing of the cases on an ex-
tensive docket. The first defended
case, that of George Hetherington vs.
Priscilla Hetherington, was begun to-
day before court took recess this after-
noon.

The case of Oscar Herman Trites of
Moncton vs. Annie Evelyn Trites,
which was begun yesterday afternoon,
was completed this morning. The plain-
tiff was the first witness and gave di-
rect evidence against his wife.

Stewart A. Trites, son of the plain-
tiff, also gave evidence. William H.
Horsman gave evidence corroborative
of that given by the plaintiff. Judge
Crocker stated that he had been
proven, but he would reserve judgment
as to the proof of marriage, the privi-
lege being given the plaintiff of pro-
ducing further proof if the court should
come to the conclusion that the proof
already offered was not sufficient.

The case of Maria Hatheway vs.
Rainford Hatheway followed. Titus
J. Carjar, K. C., appeared on behalf of
the plaintiff. The plaintiff told of the
offense committed by the defendant,
for which he was sentenced to a term
in the penitentiary, being liberated on
ticket of leave last March.

Counsel for the plaintiff informed
the court that a record and the min-
utes of the trial at which Hatheway
was convicted were not obtainable at
the office of the clerk of the peace of
Victoria County, but as he had been
crown prosecutor he could go on the
stand.

His Honor said that under the cir-
cumstances he would permit counsel
to give evidence. Upon evidence being
completed His Honor stated that guilt
had been proven. He would consider
the question of the validity of the
marriage and give a decision.

In the defended case of George Heth-
erington vs. Priscilla Hetherington,
T. J. Carter, K. C., appeared for the
plaintiff and W. F. Jones, K. C., for
the defense. Upon the application of
Mr. Jones an order for further suit
was issued. The case was con-
cluded this afternoon.

pleted in the case of Mary Louise
Gormley vs. William Gormley. Court
considers.

Eleanor Elizabeth Cunningham vs.
Wm. Henry Cunningham was also
completed. Court considers.

FARMERS EXEMPTED
Toronto, July 11.—Fifty more farm-
ers were successful yesterday in secur-
ing exemption from the appeal tribunal
of Mr. Justice Sutherland, forty-five be-
ing allowed until November, three be-
ing granted until September, and two
until August 10. On the day's hear-
ing only one farmer was refused ex-
emption, but two other men from the
same family were allowed until Novem-
ber.
