Laurentian at Westport.
The D. G. S. Laurentian is at West
port, where she took harbor when
the Tuesday blow started.

First C. P. R. Boat Due.
The S. S. Boisfort, of the C. P. R.,
freight service, is due at this port to-
load for overseas. She is the first
freighter of the service to come here
this season.

Will Be Launched Today.
The Tidewater Shipbuilders, Ltd.,
Three Rivers, will launch today their
steel steamer Canadian Rancier,
built for the Canadian Government
Merchant Marine. The Canadian

Rancier will be the second of the
four 5,100-ton deadweight steel
hullers awarded by the Government
in a contract with the Tidewater
Shipbuilders, Limited; the first, the
Canadian Sessler, was launched on
the 26th September, and it is ex-
pected that both will be commissioned be-
fore the close of navigation.

Activity at Quebec.
Five Manchester liners and four
vessels in the Furber-Wilby line are
due at Quebec before navigation
closes at that port.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the
undersigned and endorsed "Tender
for the purchase of dredge Canada
(P. W. D. No. 7)," will be received un-
til 12 o'clock noon, Thursday, Nov-
ember 27, 1919, for the purchase of
dredge "P. W. D. No. 7," registry No.
130249.

The dredge is moored in the har-
bour of Liverpool, N. S., and may be
inspected by arrangement with J. K.
Blenkinson, Superintendent of Dredges,
St. John, N. B.

The hull is of iron, built in 1872 by
Wm. Simons & Co., Renfrew, Scotland.
122 feet long, 20-foot beam.
There are two simple 22 inch x 21
inch engines; one Scotch 10 inch di-
ameter, 1 foot length boiler.

The Department is disposing of this
vessel as it finds it no longer econo-
mical to operate as a dredge. It may
be found possible to convert it into
a steamer or barge.

Intending purchasers are to assure
themselves as to the accuracy of this
