Assembly, Can., from g. e. 1854 until Sept., 1862, when elected for DeLorimier Division, Leg. Council, which he represented until the Union. Was a mem. of Ex. Council and Provincial Secy., Can., from Jany. to May, 1863. Called to Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*St. Rémi, P. Q.*

BURNHAM, *Hon.* ASA ALLWORTH. C.

Ancestors came from Eng. to one of the New England States, (where his father was born) before the Am. revolution. S. of the late Hon. Z. Burnham, who came to Canada in 1796. B. on site of the present town of Cobourg, Ont., 1808. Ed. in Canada and New York. M., 1832, Elizabeth, dau. of Saml. Street Wilmot, Esq., of Clarke, Co. Durham, Ont. Has been engaged in agricultural pursuits since 1823. A Director of the Bank of Toronto, and of the Canada Landed Credit Co. Was for several years President of the Board of Police, Cobourg; Warden of Northumberland and Durham, 1851; Treasurer of same counties, 1852; Mayor of Cobourg, 1861-2; and President of the Agricultural Association, U. C., 1862. Sat for Northumberland in L. A., Can., from 1851 to 1854; and for Newcastle division in Leg. Council, Can., from 1863 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*Cobourg, Ont.*
