

## BILL.

An Act to enable Louis Comte to recover a certain amount due to him by the Parish of St. Edouard, in the District of Montreal.

**W**HEREAS Louis Comte, of the City <sup>Preamble.</sup>  
Montreal, master mason and contrac- <sup>Recital.</sup>  
tor, did, on the eleventh day of April, one  
thousand eight hundred and forty-three, ob-  
5 tain judgment in the Court of Queen's Bench  
for the District of Montreal, against Michel  
Lussier, Augustin Arcouet, Joseph Gauthier  
*dit* St. Germain, and Vital Coupal, being the  
only survivors of the Trustees elected and ap-  
10 pointed for erecting the Church, Sacristy  
and Parsonage House of the Parish of St.  
Edouard in the District aforesaid—for the  
sum of two hundred and twenty-seven pounds  
twelve shillings and ten pence currency, be-  
15 ing the balance due to the said Louis Comte of  
the cost of erection of the buildings aforesaid,  
with interest from the twenty-eighth day of  
January one thousand eight hundred and  
forty-three, until payment, and costs since  
20 taxed at twelve pounds, fourteen shillings and  
six-pence currency; And whereas by an  
instrument made and passed in the said Pa-  
rish of St. Edouard on the tenth day of  
March one thousand eight hundred and forty,  
25 before Mtre. Brisset and his colleague, No-  
taries, it appears that at a meeting legally  
held in the said Parish, as well of the old as  
of the new Churchwardens thereof, the said  
Churchwardens did, in and by the instrument  
30 aforesaid, declare their opinion that the Trus-  
tees of the said Parish of St. Edouard should  
be released from further accountability as  
such Trustees, and that such accountability  
should thereafter be transferred to the *Fa-*  
35 *brigue* of the said Parish, and the said Trus-
