

His Majesty, by Order in Council, may permit Goods to be imported into and exported from Nova Scotia or New Brunswick,

and make such Regulations for that Purpose as He thinks fit.

Continuance of Act.

Provinces of *Nova Scotia* and *New Brunswick* of any Articles in any Ships or Vessels, under certain Limitations and Restrictions; be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful, in any Ship or Vessel in any Manner owned or navigated, to import into and export from any Port or Ports within the Province of *Nova Scotia* or *New Brunswick*, which shall be specially appointed for that Purpose by His Majesty by Order in Council, any Goods or Commodities which His Majesty by Order in Council shall specially authorize and allow to be so imported and exported respectively, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to make such Rules and Regulations for the Importation and Exportation of Goods and Commodities as aforesaid, with such Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof as shall seem fit and necessary to His Majesty by and with the Advice aforesaid.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue in force until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and twelve.
