from time to time "Be quiet 'till I get that down!" The mortality rate and the housing question came in for sharp criticism. Serious doubt was cast upon the ability of the C. C. F. to cope with these problems any more effectively than had the Liberals, and the matter was turned over to evolutions for remedy. (A sharp discussion as to the meaning of this term ensued. Hon. Dr. McGrand upheld the Darwinian theory of natural selection while Hon. J. C. Hanson defended the DeVries theory of mutations.) The seeds of doubt and fanaticism were now widely sown and to prevent further discord the debate was closed with all three members offering voluble protestations of their loyalty and affirming the superiority of the British race and the greatness of the British tradition.
