

to sell any sand, and that I thought that if he wished to dispose of sand for drain tile with the consent of the Council, and the usual dues paid, the Department might agree to the selling of it by him. Fox appeared at the Council meeting placing his case before the Members present, where after consideration it was agreed to allow him to sell sand as within stated, a certified copy of the findings of the Council relative to the above was sent to the Department. I am informed that ordinary sand is sold at about 60¢ per cord for plastering purposes. The sand for brick making would be at about the same value. I have no tariff of dues for sand. Kindly let me know what the dues for cord are, that they may be collected in the event of Fox being allowed by the Department to sell sand.
