I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant addressed to the Honorable Provincial Secretary and by him transmitted to this Department. In reply I beg to state that there is no law nor regulations in respect to the importation or export of pulp wood, pulp and printing paper in this Province.

Let me add that the tariff on pulpwood is 65 cents per cord of 128 cubic feet, but a reduction of 25 cents per cord is allowed when the timber is intended to be converted into pulp or paper within the Dominion of Canada.

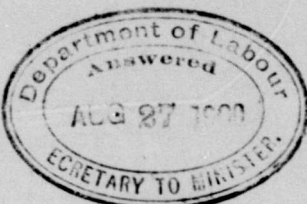
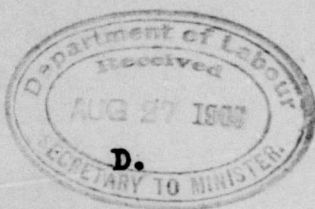
