BRITISH PREFERENCE PROPOSALS, December, 1924

New British Preference Policy. The British Government proposes to carry out its preference offer of October, 1923, so far as regards giving or increasing preference on imports

Lugarial Relations - Suprint I ready dutiable, that is,

Duties - makeumas v

Dried figs, raisins, currants, plums (duty on Empire goods to be abolished).

Sugar (stabilization of duty on Empire goods at penny a pound for ten years).

Wines (general reduction).

Tobacco (not certain - reduction of duty on Empire imports from 5/6 to 3/4 of full duty).

It will drop that part of its 1923 proposals which involved putting new daties on imports now free, in order to grant the Dominions a reduction, namely:

Dried apples, pears, peaches, etc. (10s. 6d. per cwt. on foreign; Empire free).

Preserved fruits (5s. per cwt.; Empire free).

"Raw" apples (5 shillings per cwt.; Empire free).

Honey (10 shillings per cwt.; Empire free).

Fruit juices (6 pence gallon; Empire free).

Canned salmon, lobster, etc. (10 shillings cwt.; Empire free).

Right to decide its fiscal policy.

The British Government has evidently decided to abandon the big schemes of imperial preference.

It has taken the opposite line to that which Canada took in the recent negotiations with Australia; it is declining to raise duties to give a preference.

It is of course perfectly right in deciding to adopt whatever fiscal policy it considers meets the needs of its own people, and Canada has always recognized that right, and should admit it now.

But

At the same time there are other considerations which seem to warrant attention in any reply:

Hits Canada particularly.

1. The duties which the Government is going to drop are precisely those from which Canada would have benefitted.

Canadian protests certain.

2. There is certain to be a loud howl from Canadian apple-growers, salmon-packers, etc., (note
