Ottawa, Nov. 7, 1906.

Sir,

Referring to that portion of your letter of Sept.28, last, inclosing a certificate from Agent Gagnon professing to give you some authority to act as chief of the Escoumains band, I beg to say that, the Department having written to Agent Gagnon to ascertain whether he meant to appoint you to the position of chief—which he would have no right to do unless authorized by the Department—it is now learned that Mr. Gagnon only intended to make use of your services to a very limited extent, and so the Department does not see any reason for taking any further notice of the matter.
