Memorandum for the Prime Minister

I have been informed by the C.P.R. Office in Ottawa that space has been reserved as requested from Monbreal to New York on Tuesday night, October 22nd. The space is in car 32 on the train leaving Windsor Station at 10:00 p.m. and consists of Drawing Room A and lower berths 7 and 8. Mr. Hemsley of External Affairs is having the necessary tickets secured.

No arrangements have yet been made with regard to the movement of Car 100 to Montreal and I should appreciate it if you could indicate which train you would prefer to use. The C.P.R. trains to Montreal are as follows:

4.15 a.m. - 6.45 a.m. 7.40 a.m. - 10.50 a.m. 9.00 a.m. - 11.15 a.m. 4.10 p.m. - 7.10 p.m. 5.40 p.m. - 9.40 p.m.

The 5.40 train arrives in Montreal only 20 minutes before the departure of the train for New York and it is in any event slower than the 4.10 train. In view of these considerations you might prefer to have the 4.10 used.

With regard to return accommodation, the C.P.R. officials state that if you would care to select a date for the return journey they will arrange in advance to have the necessary reservations made in New York. If you would prefer to wait until you get to New York, the C.P.R. General Agent, Mr. James Roach, will be glad to secure any accommodation that is desired.
